What new design trends are you seeing for autumn? Interiors with lighter surroundings—such as with wall finishes and the main pieces of furnishings—mixed with a pop of color like tangerine, paprika, red, indigo, kelly green or eggplant. Also, high-gloss paint on the walls.

What is the biggest design faux pas people continue to make in their own homes? Many people tend to hang their artwork too high. A good rule to follow is to have the center of the painting at about 5' 3" to 5'6" above the floor, which is eye-level for most people.

What's your go-to, never-fail paint color? There are many that I love, including Benjamin Moore's Bennington Gray (below) and Revere Pewter.

What have you recently discovered that you want to use in a project? A Belgian furniture company debuted its new outdoor collection that has French, Italian- and English-style teak furnishings that are fantastic and beautiful.
